Hello Vesterdalen Lodge,

This month we celebrate Syttende Mai and our meeting on May 15 will reflect that celebration. The social committee will host a potluck and our cultural director will find some interesting videos to share with the Lodge.

There will be the annual Syttende Mai parade in Ballard on Wednesday, May 17, so I hope some of you might go up for that. The Leif Erikson Lodge is also celebrating their 120th year as a lodge in May, so there will be activities at the Lodge in Ballard on that day,.

We will not be holding a Memorial Service in May, as we have had no deaths in the lodge this past year, for which we are thankful (there was one who was an insurance member, but not an active member).

We are also in the midst of planning our Nordic Fest for June. Pea Soup went well as the Norway Day in Olympia. These items would be less labor intensive than sandwiches, (which we have done in the past). I know the sandwiches are also enjoyed, however. We have had our event advertised in the Olympia Norway Day program (which was held on April 15) and it will be in various newsletters, so we are getting the word out. We will also advertise to our email lists. We will also need to put together a program and will sell ads to bring in some additional income. If you are able to help in any way, please let me know sometime this month. We do need help in the kitchen, making food, making items for the Bake Sale prior to the event, setting up on Friday, doing demonstrations, cleaning tables during the event, cleaning up following the event. 



A fascinating look into the Back Roads of Norway

James and Ruthanne Henderson presented a wonderful glimpse into their recent trip to Norway at our April 23 meeting. Their trip included forays through secluded and rustic countryside and they also visited friends and a farm which had been in Ruthanne's family for 14 generations.

Driving through hills and vales, they often saw herds of wild deer roaming around — the deer are protected in Norway. However, Ruthanne and James also visited a game farm where attendees are taught how to hunt and ensure that all of the animal is used.

James and Ruthanne also visited many smaller museums: often located on a family's farm. These included one with a connection to Ruthanne's family and owned by a filmmaker, where every room was decorated with special collectibles and antiques.

They visited a series of 18 locks located in the Telemark region as well as an island accessible only by a small ferry where there are no roads and everyone travels everywhere by hoat

The scenery, of course, was spectacular and varied: from an area of trains and waterfalls — a very distinctive scenery from the fjords for which Norway is well-known — to a perfect picture of a rainbow after a day of heavy rain. Thank you to the Hendersons!

Bunads

Bunads are the traditional regional clothing of Norway. With a resurgence of nationalism and increasing wealth in Norway, the wearing of bunads for special occasions has become standard throughout Norway. Bunads always have a regional connection, whether by birth, ancestry or where one currently lives. Traditionally given by parents, grandparents, or godparents for confirmation, a bunad is worn throughout the lifetime for occasions such as



baptisms, weddings, funerals, holidays like Christmas and 17 Mai. While girls are usually fully grown by the time of confirmation, their bunads are still tailored so that they can be let in and out as the wearer has life experiences that change her shape. Boys are sometimes delayed in receiving their bunads until they are fully grown.

We met a 19-year-old young man in Valdres who told us that he would probably not get his bunad until he returned



from his national service in a couple of years. Since bunads are custom-tailored, they can cost between \$2,000-\$10,000 U.S. dollars depending upon the individual pattern and amount of work involved. In addition to the clothing, a bunad includes the silver (solje,) shoes, bag, headwear and embroidery specific to the region. Chinesemade knock-offs are available, but they are considered taboo and are strongly frowned upon.

When we were visiting family in Valdres, there happened to be a convention of the "Norsk institutt fra bunad og folkedrakt" at the hotel where we were staying in Fagernes. We were able to view bunads from all over Norway and even sit in on workshops and displays for people whose careers were tailoring custom bunads. Today, the most popular bunad is the East

Telemark, made popular by Queen Sonja, who is from the same town (Drangedal) that my grandfather came from. Queen Sonja's grand-daughter was confirmed this past year and her bunad was embroidered in the East Telemark style by Sonja herself

Member Spotlight: Clayton Naset



93-year old Clayton Naset has been a lodge member for seven or eight years, after he was encouraged to join by Sonny Bellcour and Carole Wrolstad, with whom he plays music.

A guitar player since the age of 12, for about 20 years Clayton has played with the Washington Old Time Fiddlers Association. The Fiddlers play four or five times a month for the residents at nursing homes and retirement homes (in fact, when we spoke,

Clayton was preparing for a gig that evening). Clayton uses three guitars, including an acoustic Cort, and an acoustic electic Pan.

Clayton also excels as a model shipbuilder artist: we have been lucky enough to have him participate in several different Nordic Fests (and he's agreed to participate in June!)

Additionally, his ship models are included in the collections of an array of museums: the Tacoma Maritime Museum, the Museum of HIstory and Industry in Seattle (MOHAI), Seattle's Coast Guard Museum, Bremerton's Navy Museum (that model is now on loan to the Museum of Flight), and the Ballard Locks. All of Clayton's children and 12 grandkids have models, as well as the great-grandchildren. Wow!

Clayton started building model ships in 1969: he sends back East for the plans and buys materials from hardware stores and lumber yards. While a few ships have taken about five years to build — such as the eight-foot long aircraft carrier, the USS Nimitz. Most take about one-one and a half years.

And, in case you're wondering, while most of the models Clayton builds are modern ships, he's also built some Viking boats!

Clayton is active with the Puget Sound Shipbuilders Association; and it is through that group that several connections with museums have been forged.

Clayton hails from Minnesota, orginally; he is Norwegian on both sides, with his mother's side from the Hadeland region near Oslo, and father's from Arnafjord -- a small fjord that feeds into the larger Sognefjord (Bergen area).

About the lodge, Clayton says: "It's just a friendly group of people; we all have a common interest." As well, he says the lodge is very well-run and managed. But what does he like most about Vesterdalen?

"Meeting all the members," he says. "That's the best thing — the camaraderie."
