Kultur Hjørne

Did you know that one of the jewels of Auburn — Soos Creek Botanical Garden — is on land purchased by a Norwegian immigrant? Come meet the Garden's founder, Maurice Skagen, at our September meeting.

The 23 acres on which the garden is located was originally part of 200 acres purchased by Maurice Skagen's Norwegian immigrant ancestors. In 1891, Norwegian Ole Evensen Oie acguired a 160 acre piece from the Northern Pacific Railroad. Oie paid about \$10 per acre. Mr. Skagan's book — History of the Soos Creek Plateau from 1860 to 1960 — delves into the early history.

I have visited SCBG several times, and always been impressed with the plants, the history, and the preservation of this wonderful resource by the Norwegian homesteaders and their descendants. The Garden was founded in the last several years — so it's a relatively recent addition to the premiere publicly accessible gardens in the Pacific Northwest.

The heirloom garden is definitely ADA accessible, and very worth seeing.

The garden slopes down to a pavilion (the slope could be a bit challenging for walkers, but several have been able to navigate it), and then onto a broad lawn planted on both sides with a profusion of colorful flowers, bushes, and trees — all with a stunning view of Mt. Rainier.

Soos Creek is just absolutely gorgeous, but known as well for its Kalmia collection (mountain laurel), Cecile Brunner roses, "Cynthia" rhododendron, "Blue Wave" hydrangea, dahlias and wisterias.

The Garden holds Pavilion By The Pond Horticultural Programs, typically on the third Wednesday of the month, 12:30 pm to 2 pm. (No charge, but donations gladly accepted.) SCBG suggests referring to its calendar for exact dates.

We will be excited to meet Maurice Skagen, such a wonderful citizen of Auburn!
