# Scholarships Available


If you have a child or grandchild who

The Son's of Norway Book Club will meet at Maggie's on Meeker on March 12, 2024, at 11 AM. The book we will be discussing is *The Weaver and the Witch Queen* by Genevieve Gornichec.

The lives of two women—one desperate only to save her missing sister, the other a witch destined to become queen of Norway—intertwine in this

spellbinding, powerful novel of Viking Age history and myth. When Oddny's farm is destroyed and Signy is kidnapped by Viking raiders, Oddny is determined to save her sister no matter the cost. And in the far north, Gunnhild, who fled her home years ago to learn the ways of a witch, is surprised to find her destiny seems to be linked with that of the formidable King Eirik, heir apparent to the ruler of all Norway.

But the bonds—both enchanted and emotional—that hold the two women together are strong, and when they find their way back to each other, these bonds will be tested in ways they never could have foreseen in this deeply moving novel of magic, history, and sworn sisterhood.

Genevieve Gornichec earned her degree in history from The Ohio State University, but she got as close to majoring in Vikings as she possibly could, and her study of the Norse myths and Icelandic sagas became her writing inspiration. Kultur Hjørne

At our last meeting in February, Bjørn Ruud, owner of Scandinavian Specialties, piqued our appetite for Scandinavian food, crafts and housewares.

Ever wonder why the sausage or the fish cakes at Scandinavian Specialties in Ballard taste so great? Bjørn told us a bit about the fascinating lore behind the store. The store fills a crucial niche for Scandinavian culture in the Seattle area, with its café, food, gifts, crafts, and housewares.

Lodge member Carol Larson was speaking for many when she said how impressed she is by the quality of items sold there.

And it's no wonder: owner Bjørn has made sure that he continues to stock and sell what his customers like: whether those things are great-quality craft or housewares items from well-regarded distributors or the same fish cakes that his mom used to make him growing up. In fact, those fish cakes are the best-selling item at Scandinavian Specialties today.

Even more surprising, perhaps, is that Scandinavian Specialties signature sausage is ground on a 121-year old machine! That's right! in 2024, the best machine for the job was manufactured in 1903! Rudd says that it would cost upwards of \$20,000 (a big investment for a small business owner, he noted) to find a machine that replicates the fine ground and other special properties of the vintage machine.

We were even more grateful to Bjørn for taking the time to talk with us considering that over the weekend before a car had accidentally smashed into the front of the store! It will take about a month to repair the damage, Bjørn said, and chalked it up to yet another of the travails he handles as a small business owner.

Rudd is a true entrepreneur: In addition to Scandinavian Specialties, he runs businesses associated with music record labels and merchandise, a wholesale flag business, as well as an import business supplying the German felt hats sold in Leavenworth. He gets away from it all at his off-grid property on Camano Island. "I think it's nice to have things to do," he says.
