# Longest Tunnel in Norway

Norway is digging deep—literally—to transform travel on its rugged west coast. The massive Rogfast tunnel project is set to become the world's longest and deepest subsea road tunnel, plunging 1,300 feet below sea level and stretching nearly 27 kilometers beneath the sea. Once completed by 2033, this fourlane tunnel will connect the cities of Stavanger and Bergen, cutting out ferry rides and slashing travel time by up to 40 minutes.

Costing around \$2 billion, the project involves removing a staggering 8 million cubic meters of rock—a feat of engineering that's making headlines worldwide.

# The Restauration Sails Away

I participated in events commemorating 200 years since the initial launch of the *Restauration* in Stavanger, Norway on July 3 & 4.

Many gathered to commemorate 200 years of organized migration to North America and to wish a safe passage to the crew of the replica ship.

In Stavanger I was warmly received and hosted by members from District 8. I sincerely appreciate everything they did to help plan my trip and guide me to each event.

While in Stavanger, I had a chance to visit Sverd i Fjell (the three swords in the rock), the Maritime Museum where they had a display of the *Restauration*, and Ledaal, the Kings residence.

That evening there was a celebration of the migration with a program and meal. At this event they tried to recreate the foods of 1825 including bread made on the ship with Madeira wine from a cask found floating in the Atlantic by the crew of the original *Restauration*.

The big day—the 4th of July—I was able to attend a service at the Domkirke (Stavanger Cathedral). We proceeded to the harbor to see the *Restauration* waiting to start its journey. Many, many boats escorted the *Restauration* out of the harbor. It was an amazing sight.

What an honor it was to represent Sons of Norway and to participate in all these events. It was an amazing opportunity. I can't wait to see the United States welcome the Restauration on October 9th in New York. This event is so important to all of us who have a connection to Norway on both sides of the Atlantic. I hope each of you have an opportunity to attend an event whether at your lodge, online or—better yet—for those in the U.S., attend one of the welcoming events for the *Restauration* and be a part of history.
